The President of The Republic of Azerbaijan takes a close interest in the construction of Baku Ring Road

On July 23, President of the Republic of Azerbaijan Ilham Aliyev took a close interest in the construction of Baku Ring Road.

Construction of Baku Ring Road was commenced on September 2006 by Azerinsaatservis LLC. upon the order of the Ministry of Transportation. The main road is 21,5 km long and the (side) road is 11,65 km together with Bileceri Downgrade. The width of the 6-lane road's soil bed will be 33,5 meters and the width of the main road will be 22,5



meters. Each lanes will have a width of 3,75 meters. Pursuant to the project, asphalt coating of the road will be 19-27 cm thick. 60% of the earthworks, 11% of the asphalt works, 90% of the drainage pipe laying works and 80% of the communication line transportation works have been completed.

Besides, the leader was informed about the technical and economic indicators of the road's retaining walls. It is stated that the construction of a 22.359 m² earth retaining wall is predicted so that any landslide and cracks can be detected and prevented during the construction of the road.

10% of these works has been completed. A 640-meter-long concrete retaining wall is being constructed. 320 meters of the wall is ready. It is planned that 652 drainages will be placed to the land.

Afterwards, President Ilham Aliyev arrived at the section of Baku Ring Road that will link to the main road at the border of Baku-Iran. The President was informed that, within the framework of the project, it was planned 6 bridges, 1 underpass, 1 subway and 4 bus stops would be constructed. Up to present, 80% of the bridges and 96% of the underpasses and subways have been constructed. More than 400 workers and approximately 300 technical tools and equipment have been used for the works. In total, 63% of the works has been completed and Baku Ring Road is planned to be opened on August 2010. President Ilham Aliyev ordered the works to be completed in time and made necessary recommendations.
